

Simon Finch In conversation with Andrew Taylor



Simon Finch is an Antiquarian Bookseller, a passion that began when he was 12.

He has owned shops in Mayfair, Notting Hill and Holt. The firm is known for the eclectic nature of material handled from the First Folio of Shakespeare to the wilder shores of the counterculture. In 1998 he bought Voewood, one of the finest Arts and Crafts houses in England, just outside Holt. Previously used as an institution the restoration took many years, and in the Arts and Crafts tradition Simon used local artists and craftsmen. The house has a unique literary history which Simon will be talking about, alongside his fascinating career.






Afternoon Tea with Erica James



An Evening with Dowland & Donne Music and Poetry from the English Renaissance

Enjoy a special evening celebrating the enduring legacy of two towering figures of the English Renaissance: composer and lutenist John Dowland, and poet and Anglican cleric John Donne.

Though they worked in different artistic spheres, they shared a profound sense of spirituality that shaped their work. Dowland's hauntingly beautiful songs and lute music remain some of the most expressive compositions of the period, while Donne's metaphysical poetry continues to captivate with its intensity, wit, and intellectual depth.

This unique event will feature live performances of Dowland's music by acclaimed lutenist Matthew Wadsworth, interwoven with dramatic readings of Donne's poetry by leading actor Alex Jennings.



Matthew Wadsworth, Lutenist

Working as a soloist and chamber musician, Matthew Wadsworth has appeared at most major concert halls and festivals across the UK and Europe, and can often be heard on radio, both in live performances and recordings.

Matthew has worked as a soloist with the Scottish Chamber Orchestra and Northern Chamber Orchestra, and as a continuo player with The Academy of Ancient Music, English Touring Opera and the Birmingham Opera Company, to name but a few.

His many recordings for Channel Classics, Linn Records, Deux-Elles and Wigmore Live have all received international critical acclaim and have been featured as Gramophone Editor's Choice on four occasions.



Alex Jennings CBE, Actor

Alex Jennings is an actor of the stage and screen, who has worked extensively with the Royal Shakespeare Company and the National Theatre. He has received three Olivier Awards, for *Too Clever by Half, Peer Gynt*, and *My Fair Lady*, the only performer to have won awards in the drama, musical, and comedy categories.

His film work includes, most recently, Wes Anderson's *The Phoenician Scheme* and the forthcoming *A Ballad of a Small Player*. Other film work includes playing Prince Charles in Stephen Frears's film *The Queen*, and as Alan Bennett in *The Lady in the Van*.

His extensive work on television includes playing the Duke of Windsor in *The Crown*. Other recent appearances include *MobLand*, *Wolf Hall: The Mirror and the Light*, *A Very Royal Scandal*, *A Very English Scandal*, and *Small Axe: Mangrove*. Jennings was appointed CBE for services to drama in 2024.

Nick Trend is a senior writer at *The Daily Telegraph*, where he has spent three decades writing about the world's art treasures and producing guides to museums and art collections.

His latest book, What Art Can Tell Us About Love, explores the passionate affairs that inspired some of the world's greatest masterpieces. Nick's previous books include Art Firsts: The Story of Art in 30 Pioneering Works. His next book The Art of Travel: Italy in the Footsteps of the Great Artists is out in September. 

Her books include Dinner with Mr Darcy: Recipes inspired by the novels and letters of Jane Austen, Sunday Times bestseller Scoff: A History of Food and Class in Britain; and Stuffed: A Political History of What We Eat and Why It Matters. She co-curated the exhibition Food Glorious Food at the Charles Dickens Museum based on her book, Dinner with Dickens. Nick Acheson Simon Barnes Ben Garrod Nature At Its Best


Three of our favourite East Anglian nature writers will be in conversation discussing the growth in popularity of nature writing over the last decade.

Nick Acheson is a Norfolk naturalist and conservationist. He is an ambassador for Norfolk Wildlife Trust, a patron of Felbeck Trust. and chair of Deepdale Conservation Trust, which headstarts curlews and breeds corncrakes for reintroduction. His first book *The Meaning of Geese* was named East Anglian Book of the Year 2023. He has two books out in 2026: one in partnership with Norfolk Wildlife Trust, honouring its centenary, and another with the Society of Wildlife Artists. documenting the artists' year-long exploration of Massingham Heath.

Simon Barnes is the author of many wild volumes including the *Bad Birdwatcher* trilogy. At one stage

he worked as chief sportswriter of *The Times* while writing two weekly wildlife columns for the same newspaper. He is co-founder and trustee of the wildlife charity Conservation South Luangwa UK. He lives with this family on a marsh in the Broads. The red-footed falcon he claims as a garden tick was probably a kestrel.

Ben Garrod is Professor of Evolutionary Biology and Science Engagement at UEA. He is an award-winning TV and radio presenter of numerous BBC documentaries including Secrets of Bones, Attenborough and the Giant Dinosaur and Baby Chimp Rescue.




